During the Legislative Session, KHCA President and CEO, Linda MowBray, attends meetings almost daily with state lawmakers to make sure KHCA/KCAL members' voices are heard. Outside of Session, KHCA/KCAL is in close contact with state officials from various agencies to ensure you are not only kept up-to-date on regulation changes, but your expertise is put to use at the state level. LEGISLATIVE

2023 Legislative Wins

- Full rebase to the Medicaid rates using cost years 2020 -2022. This added 83.9 million to the overall budget (all funds)
- Medicaid add-on of \$19.54 per Medicaid Resident per day from July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024 adding 61.7 million to the overall budget (all funds)
- HCBS Rate Increase
 - FE: from \$5.04 to \$5.55
 - o PD: \$3.76 to \$4.55
- Added Proviso "Legislative committee to study nursing home rates during interim committee sessions prior to 2024 legislative session"
 - A Legislative committee met for two days to discuss Medicaid reimbursement rates and the need to continue to stabilize providers in order to prevent closures.
- Facility Operated Beauty/Barber Shops
 - Placed into statute that facility operated beauty/barber shops are not inspected by the state cosmetology board but by KDADS. This ended a 30 year back and forth between agencies on who had jurisdiction.

2023 Legislative Stops

- Stopped adding Appeal rights for Assisted Living Residents who have been given a 30-day notice
- Stopped requiring individuals riding in facility owned vans use of their own personal handicapped placard instead of issuing a license tag for the van to the facility
- Stopped "No patient left alone" which would have requiring facilities to allow in-person visitation despite federal mandates

Legislative Goals for 2024

- 1. Ask Legislature to extend Medicaid add-on through Fiscal Year 2027.
 - Allow for parody adjustments for transition from RUGS based CMI to PDPM.
- 2. Ask Legislatures to consider provider assessment on MCO's to leverage Federal money to enhance total LTSS budget.
- Leverages additional provider-based funds to increase the upper payment limit (UPL).
- · No cost to the state.
- Increase available funds for all Medicaid rates.
- 3. Consider behavioral health add on for Medicaid residents who have triggered for level II PASRR letter/special services or have a dementia and other behavioral diagnosis
 - More opportunity for appropriate placement and treatment.
 - · Supports resident centered care models
 - Supports decreased use of antipsychotic medications
 - · Provides opportunity for better quality outcomes
 - Incentivize providers to expand behavioral health services.
- 4. Increase upper payment limit in cost reporting for the Real and Personal Property Fee. The Real and Personal Property Fee is paid in lieu of an allowable cost of mortgage interest, depreciation, lease expense and/or amortization of leasehold improvements under the Medicaid reimbursement calculation. We hear from provider after provider that the \$10.47 is estimated to be \$25 to \$30 dollars per day as outlined on cost report data. This shortfall prevents providers from being able to improve their buildings or pursue any other capital projects.
- 5. Explore quality-based metrics and programs such as AHCA/NCAL Quality Awards (based on the Macolm Baldrige system) or Joint Commission to acquire "deemed status".
 - This would encourage quality improvement programs as well as potentially reducing the frequency of federal surveys.
- 6. Explore increasing the amount of personal needs allowance for residents on Medicaid in nursing homes. Currently, the rate is \$65 per month and has not been increased for over 10 years.
